What is it?

When emergencies happen, find out what you need to know when you need to know it with NotifyJoCo.

NotifyJoCo is a mass notification system designed to keep Johnson County residents, businesses, people who work in or visit the county and others informed of emergencies in Johnson County, including weather warnings, water main breaks, public safety alerts and natural disasters. Local authorities in partner communities use NotifyJoCo to alert you and keep you informed.

By registering for NotifyJoCo, you'll get real-time messages from the county, your public water and wastewater utilities, and any partner cities you choose.

Keep track of what's going on near your home, your workplace, your children's school and daycare, and more. **Customize your locations and contact preferences to get alerts at home, at work, by phone, email or text.** You can also set your preferences to stay informed of non-emergency events like public meetings, city sports events, local festivals, etc.

Register now to customize your personal information. When your contact information or preferences change, log in and update them.

2.) Be Sure to be registered to vote in Johnson County

To register to vote, or change your registration - By mail or fax: Print the Voter Registration Application, complete all information, sign and send it to the Election Office. Registration Applications may be mailed to 2101 E. Kansas City Road, Olathe, KS 66061; Faxed to 913-791-8934 or 913-791-8935 or scanned and e-mailed to registration@jocoelection.org. A photo of the document may be texted to (913) 953-9539.

🗳️ To register, you must be a United States citizen, a resident of the State of Kansas, and have reached the age of 18 years before the next election

🗳️ State law requires that all voters show photo identification.

🗳️ You may register to vote at any time. However, voter registration always closes 21 days prior to an Election Day. Applications must be postmarked no later than the 21st day prior to any election to be eligible to vote.

🗳️ If you change your name or address, or wish to change your party affiliation, update your voter registration by completing a new voter registration application.

🗳️ You may register in person at any city hall or the Election Office.

🗳️ You may also register to vote or change your registration information online with a valid Kansas driver's license or a nondriver's identification card. Online Voter Registration is provided through the Statewide voter registration system: (Requires a valid KS ID)
